Mail-O-Graphic Announces 2012 Entry

The HBW will be conducting its Fifth Annual Mail-O-Graphic Tournament in March. This tournament is open to all adult certified bowlers and the scores will be based on the individual's league scores for the respective dates. Multiple entries are allowed and individuals may enter for every league in which they participate as a regular or a sub during the week of the tournament. There were 93 entries last year so let's try for over 100 this year. Collect entries from other bowlers in your league and send them along with your entries then collect their scores when they bowl and send them with yours also. This is one of the easiest tournaments you will find since there are no travel expenses and no lineage fees. Just be sure your entries are postmarked by the closing date, March 16, or they cannot be accepted. This is a USBC certified tournament.

Entries may be submitted through email to dirickel@comcast.net. If you email your entry, you will receive a return response upon receipt of your message. However, you still will have to have your entry fee postmarked no later than the deadline, **March 16, 2012.** ☺

Bowling Ball Ballistics 101

BALLISTICS - (*buh-lis-tiks*) - is the science of mechanics that deals with the flight, behavior, and effects of projectiles, especially bullets, gravity bombs, rockets, bowling balls or the like; the science or art of designing and accelerating projectiles so as to achieve a desired performance.

Okay, so I planted bowling balls in the definition, but just let it settle in a bit and you'll understand why. Meanwhile, welcome to Bowling Ball Ballistics 101; a simple comprehensive approach to understanding the equipment and physics of bowling.

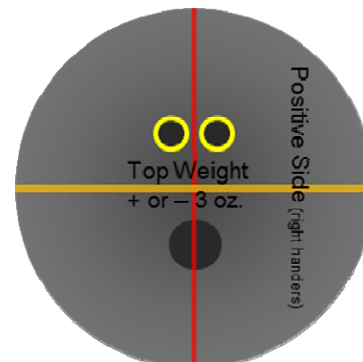
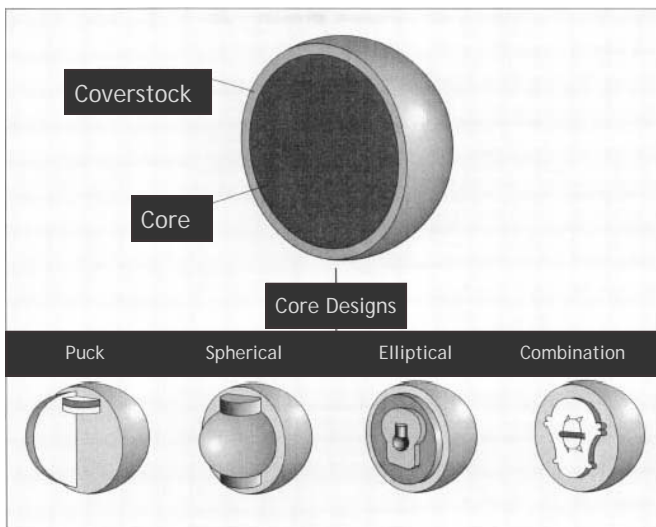
In this edition, we'll talk about that mysterious extra hole that some bowling balls have. You've all seen it, that silly hole that appears to have no meaning on the side of a bowling ball. **So why is it there?** Simple. To begin with, the USBC requires it. **Does it have a name?** Yes, its called the balance hole. **Then what does it do?** Okay, STOP! Let's take it from the top.

A bowling ball has more characteristics than just it's plain old gross/total weight, which is usually 12 to 16 pounds. However, there's a little bit more to it than that. When you get that new high performance reactive resin ball rather than the standard plastic ball, the inside is going to have a core specifically designed by the ball manufacturer. Cores come in many shapes and sizes and weigh about six pounds. Cores set in the

middle of the ball are called a symmetrical core ball and cores placed off center are asymmetrical in design. The purpose of the core is to create certain types of motion which commonly is referred to as hook.

After drilling, your Pro-shop operator will weigh the ball on a Do-do Scale or Perfect Scale to verify it is within USBC specifications. They check the Finger or Thumb Weight, Top Weight, and the Side Weight of the ball. The USBC allows the top of the ball (the spot between where your fingers and thumb go in) to be (+) or (-) 3 oz. Now drawing a line straight down between the fingers (bridge) through the thumb hole will divide the ball vertically (see ball illustration below). The side of the ball your ring finger is on is referred to as the Positive Side of the ball; this is the side that will hit the pocket. The USBC allows (+) or (-) 1 oz. of Positive Weight, Finger Weight or Thumb Weight. More than likely, the positive side of the ball will weigh the most and in many cases, will not meet specifications.

So what happens now? That's where the balance hole finally comes into play. Drilling that hole takes off the necessary weight to bring the ball back into specification and that's why some holes are bigger than others. The size and placement of the hole will determine when and how the ball reacts by changing the dynamics of the weight block...but we'll save that for another time. - A bowling accomplishment achieved by one of our members, which is a

milestone for them? **We all need** a pat on the back.

- How about a local bowling center that provides extraordinary services to its patrons and our members? Just a business you say... think of those who do not service our members very well. A **well-deserved thank you** via a state article may provide more kindness!
- Did you have an Annual Meeting you were impressed with that you would like to boast about? What **impressed** you?
- Had an enjoyable time at National Convention you would like to share?

Your board members have no interest in writing articles two or three times a year?

- Look elsewhere from the board.
- Check your youth leagues for a student who may be willing or even anxious to write. Some scholarship applications and/or committees look as such extra curriculum to qualify for scholarships.
- Check your senior leagues. Often not only do they have the skill and interest, but they also have the experiences for a variety of topics with time to compose the article.
- Many people simply need and want to be asked.

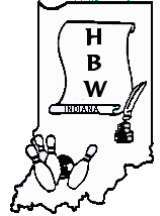
Does someone interested feel that their writing skills are inadequate for submitting an article?

- Photographs will be judged on originality and composition.
- Submitted photographs are the property of HBW.
- Send the photographs unmounted with your name, address, and telephone number on back.

COLUMN ARTICLE. May be written for a newspaper, magazine, newsletter, etc. -Or- an article written for the **IN INDIANA** "Reports Around Indiana" Column.

KIM WOODALL – BACK-TO-BACK PERFECTION

What seemed to be just another fun night of 10-Pin for the Lady Bugs League on the Tuesday just after the Christmas holiday, took a turn towards extraordinary - times two. Kim Woodall took to the lanes at All Star Bowl with teammates Lori Worland, Eryn Bowling, Ashley Cox and Theresa Smith-Dill. She started throwing well right off the bat that night; however, pin carry was not on her side. With pesky corner pins and whiffing a high hit two pin late in the game, Kim was able to salvage a 194 game. Yeah, we've all been there, but what happened next was astonishing and completely unexpected.

Without making any adjustments to her game, no ball change, nothing, and keeping the same strike line with maybe just a one or two board deviation from her original spot, Kim started throwing nothing but strikes. Kim hit 300 the second game, her first since March of 2005. Amongst all the hugs and high fives, her husband Tom came over from the Tuesday Night Budweiser Men's League to congratulate her on sixth career 300 game. But, the excitement didn't stop there...

Kim stuck with the exact game plan and began stringing the X's again in game three. By the middle of the game, word had spread throughout the center that Kim was on the threshold of perfection once again. Husband Tom was peering over to the ladies' side keeping an eye on the missus' status. Kim remembered getting a trip 9 pin somewhere between frames 7 and 9 while every other strike was a solid pocket hit. As she stood on the approach to begin the 10th frame, that's when the wobbly feeling in her legs became evident. Managing to get the first strike out of the way, she turned to good friend and teammate Theresa Smith-

Dill and said, "I can't do this!" Theresa kept her calm and simply replied, "Yes you can." Once again, Kim threw at the pocket and kept the string alive with 23 in a row. On her final ball, Kim was thinking to herself "OK, just stay upright and don't do anything stupid!" The wobbly feeling in her legs had now progressed to no feeling at all. "It felt like I was floating across the approach." Nevertheless, she nailed the final strike for back-to-back 300s. "I couldn't have done it without Theresa. She was there to give me the push I needed; she is a great friend to have."

When I first started interviewing Kim, she came straight out and told me that she didn't want to do this because she felt like she was patting herself on the back. I only had to ask a few questions and could tell she was still riding high from Tuesday night; well who wouldn't be! Kim was telling me about how her day went, how she had lost her mom a year ago, and how close she is with her step dad. They had lunch together on what would have been their 20th anniversary. She had remembered having a peaceful feeling throughout the rest of the day like mom was with her. Makes you want to think if stuff like that really has an effect on a person's well-being on and off the lanes.

The local and state USBC Associations have checked their records and found that Jada Mocaby accomplished the same feat of back-to-back 300 games (866 series) in January 2004. Kim had also mentioned that her husband, Tom, had back-to-back 300's in 1999, making this an even rarer occurrence. Congratulations once again to Kim Woodall for such an outstanding achievement.

Official Rules

1. The tournament will be open to all Adult bowlers with a USBC membership card who bowl in certified competition and have bowled at least 21 games in their respective leagues before the qualifying dates. This is a USBC Certified Tournament.
2. Entry fee is \$10.00 per person, per league. Prize fund will be returned 100% on a ratio of 1 in 6 entries. Entry fee breakdown is: \$6.00 Prize Fund, \$2.50 to HBW Ways & Means, and \$1.50 to tournament expense.
3. Handicap shall be based on 90% of 210, based on member's current average of 21 games or more at the time of participation. Players may submit entries for each league in which they bowl, but may cash only once. Current average in respective league shall be used.
4. The tournament dates will be March 19 through March 25, 2012. Only scores bowled in certified competition will be used. If the player is absent the week of tournament, he/she may use the scores from the following week (March 26 through April 1, 2012). If the player is unable to bowl either week, the entry fee will be forfeited (no refunds).
5. The entry form and subsequent score sheet must be completely filled out or the player may be disqualified without refund of entry. Bowler's USBC ID number must accompany the entry.
6. Entry deadline is March 16, 2012, with entries postmarked no later than March 16, 2012. You may submit applications by e-mail, but check must be received before entry is official. Confirmations will be sent for e-mail entries only.
7. Scores bowled must be verified by your league secretary or you may send your league recap sheet with the verification form. Scores must be returned by April 10, 2012 or they will be disqualified.
8. Please submit a separate entry form for each entry and/or league in which you will be bowling. Full fees must accompany entry.
